











Practical Ideas – Language, Physical and Creative



At the end of the day, ask your child what their favourite part was. Can they explain why in a sentence? You could ask them to draw a picture and write about their favourite part too.



Encourage your child to set up an obstacle course outside, or inside if not possible. This can be using anything easily accessible and safe. Ask your child to make their own rules and explain them to you.



Ask your child to create a spring picture. You could discuss their ideas as they are making it. They could use felt tips, coloured crayons, collage pieces, paint or safe, natural materials that you can find outside.



Practical Ideas – Maths, Phonics and Lockdown Live Activity



Encourage your child to discover who is the tallest. They could measure using a size chart, paper, by comparing size standing up or they may think of a different way! Ask them to explain who is the tallest and how they found out.



Ask your child if they can find any of these objects. They all link to the ai, igh, oa and oo sounds. Can they find anything else linked to those sounds? You could ask your child to write what they have found.

EYFS Developing Motor Skills Using Scissors – Guidance for Parents/Carers

Activity Outcomes

• In this video, your child will practise their fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination.

Setting up

What you will need

- Toilet roll tubes
- Scissors (parental supervision required)
- Pens/crayons
- Straws (pencils would also work, or any form of stick)

Activity Guide

Activity 1 – Making puppets

- Using crayons and toilet roll tubes, decorate them to look like a character and colour around the top to give the 'puppet' some 'hair'.
- With scissors, carefully cut down the roll to give the 'puppet' some hair.
- Your child could then create a puppet show or trim the hair on their puppet.

Activity 2 – Cutting for accuracy

- Using toilet roll tubes, draw lines along the tubes in a variety of patterns
- Your child can then use the scissors to cut along the lines carefully to develop their accuracy.

Activity 3 - Developing Hand-Eye Coordination Game

- Pierce holes randomly around the toilet tube (adult can prepare this before the activity). Make sure the hole is the correct size for the straw/stick that you intend your child to use.
- Using straws (or any other stick) ask your child to thread the straw through one hole and out the other side.

Questions you could ask your child during the activity

- Can you try different ways to cut with the scissors?
- Which pattern do you think will be easy to cut? Why?
